History of Senate Bean Soup

Whatever uncertainties may exist in the Senate of the United States, one thing is sure, Bean Soup is on the menu of the Senate Restaurants every day. The origin of this culinary decree has been lost in antiquity, but there are several oft-repeated legends.

One story has it that Senator Fred Thomas Dubois of Idaho, who served in the Senate from 1901 to 1907, when chairman of the committee that supervised the Senate Restaurants, gaveled through a resolution requiring that Bean Soup be on the menu every day.

Another account attributes the Bean Soup mandate to Senator Knute Nelson of Minnesota, who expressed his fondness for it in 1903.

In any case, Senators and their guests are always assured of a hearty, nourishing dish they know they can rely upon for its delightful flavor and epicurean qualities.

Legislative Buzzers and Signal Lights

One (1) long ring at hour of convening

One (1) red light to remain lighted at all times when Senate is in actual session

Where lights exist they will correspond with rings

<i>1 Rings</i>	<i>Yeas and Nays</i>
<i>2 Rings</i>	<i>Quorum Call</i>
<i>3 Rings</i>	<i>Call of Absentees</i>
<i>4 Rings</i>	<i>Adjournment or Recess (End of daily session)</i>
<i>5 Rings</i>	<i>Seven and a Half Minutes Remaining on Yea and Nay Vote</i>
<i>6 Rings</i>	<i>Morning Business Concluded (Lights cut off immediately) Recess During Daily Session (Lights stay on during period of recess)</i>

Throughout the Senate Office Buildings and the Senate Wing of the Capitol signal lights and clocks containing signal lights can be observed. The lights and associated buzzer denoting a change in the light signal indicate activity on the Senate floor.

Morning business is a period of time set aside for messages from the President, reports and communications from heads of Departments, messages from the House of Representatives, presentations of petitions and memorials, reports of committees, introductions of bills and joint resolutions and the submission of other resolutions.

Until the period of morning business has been concluded the Senate will not proceed to other business.
